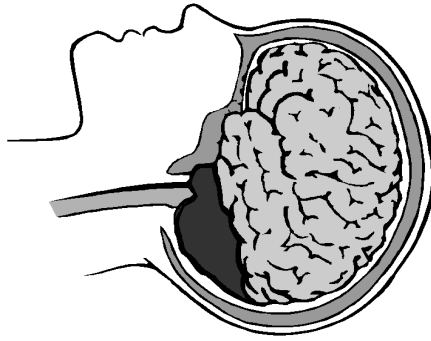

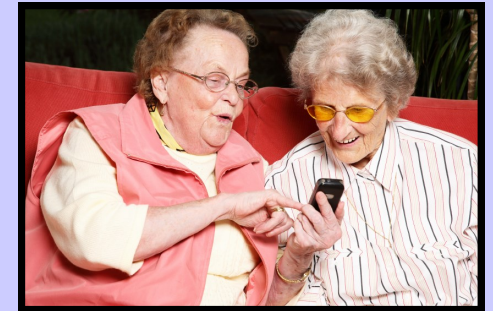

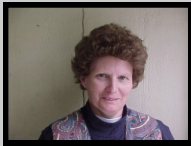
Sally Albrecht, M.A.
